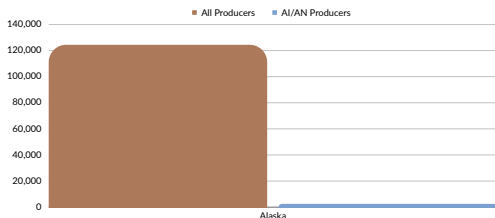

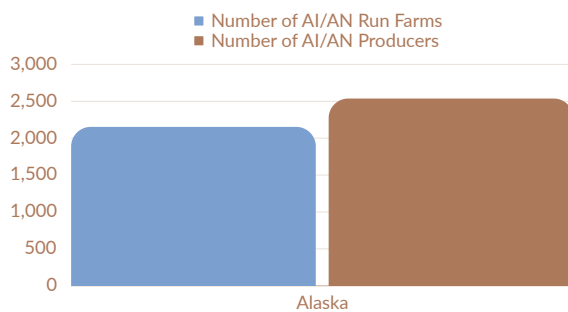

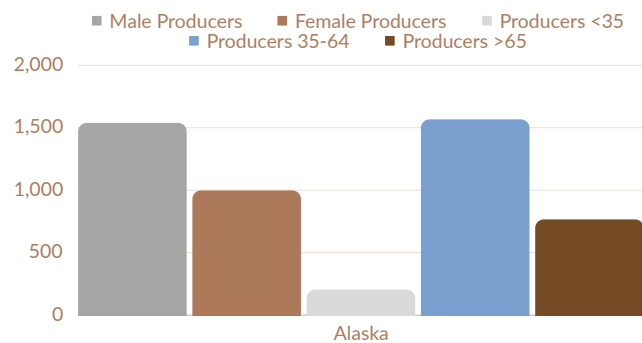

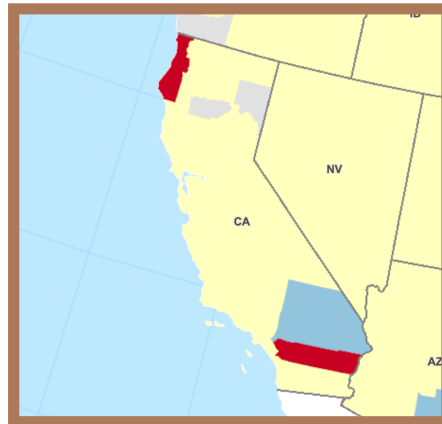

2015 FDPIR Sites

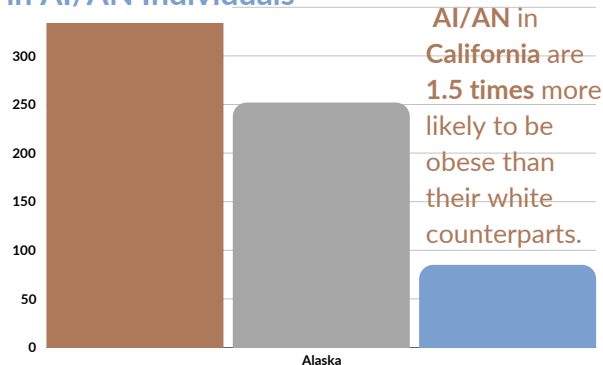

The total market value of products sold by AI/AN producers is \$505,627,000, which is 1% of all farms in California.

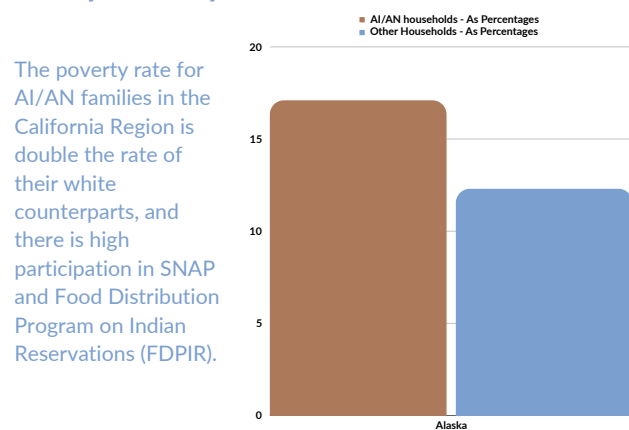
Number of Nutrition Related Deaths in AI/AN Individuals¹¹



AI/AN in California are 1.5 times more likely to be obese than their white counterparts.

Family Poverty Rates for 2023¹²



The poverty rate for AI/AN families in the California Region is double the rate of their white counterparts, and there is high participation in SNAP and Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR).
