








Number of Nutrition Related Deaths in AI/AN Individuals 111

Family Poverty Rates for 2023¹²

The poverty rate for AI/AN families in the Midwest Region is more than double the rate for all other households, and there is high participation in SNAP and Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR).
